


PRESIDENT'S CORNER



PARKING SQUEEZED NEAR MCCLATCHY LIBRARY

You may have noticed that street parking surrounding the Library is now 1 hour instead of 2 hours, 7 days a week. This happened after the Sacramento City Council voted on new parking restrictions near the new Channel 24 music venue that has opened at 1800 24th Street. The new restrictions will be imposed from P Street to V Street and 20th to 28th streets.

While residents near the venue applaud this measure, people coming to the library for TaiChi classes and

other meetings or events could face issues with parking.

"The option presented by the city council was to protect the currently existing residential parking for the people that live in this part of midtown already," said Reddit User NOTinMYbelts after the City Council vote. "The city's solution was 1-hour parking limits around the surrounding residential blocks, using EXISTING city parking lots/structures that are nearby, and encouraging people to use the city's light-rail infrastructure (that literally pulls up directly next to the concert venue)."

While that is true, using RT alone may not solve the problem.

"The reason people don't take sacrt to nightlife in Sac is because SacRT can't get them home," said Reddit User nmpls. "They can't make the other options

> least an extra service or a few night busses on busy routes near the venue as part of this plan."

HOW IT WORKS:


- Sign up or log in to <u>Beanstack</u> (you can sign up multiple readers in your household).
- Join the Summer Reading Challenge!
- Read what you love and log your reading.
- Complete activities to earn badges.
- Earn prizes for reading!



You can also download the **Beanstack app** to track your activity, and you can complete the challenge offline. Just stop by any **library branch** to ask for a Reading Log.

PRIZES:

- Youth who read 5 books earn 500 points good for one free book of their choice (first 500 points only).
- Adults who read 5 books earn 500 points to receive one coupon good for one book at the Book Den and either an enamel pin or a tote bag (first 500 points only).
- Readers of all ages who read 25 books receive a Summer Reading medal.


SUNROOM UPDATE
